About Ridgeview School:

Ridgeview School is a small, semi-rural primary school located in Paremoremo on Auckland's North Shore. We provide education for students from Years 1–6 in a nurturing environment that values strong relationships, high expectations, and a sense of belonging. Our small size allows us to truly know each child as an individual. We pride ourselves on being a “small but mighty” school, where students are supported to grow academically, socially, and emotionally, while feeling safe, valued, and connected.

Learning at Ridgeview is organised through three collaborative learning hubs:

- Wāhi Koru (Juniors) – supporting our youngest learners to build strong foundations
- Wāhi Pitau (Middles) – developing confidence, curiosity, and independence
- Wāhi Pakari (Seniors) – preparing students for leadership and transition to intermediate school

Our school culture is guided by our REPS values:

- Respect (Whakaute)
- Excellence (Hiranga)
- Positive Relationships (Whanaungatanga)
- Self-Management (Rangatiratanga)

These values are explicitly taught, modelled by staff, and embedded across all aspects of school life.

Ridgeview School places a strong emphasis on local curriculum design, using our unique environment to enrich learning. Students engage in hands-on experiences connected to sustainability, environmental stewardship (kaitiakitanga), and place-based learning, including school gardens and community projects.

We also recognise that every learner is different. Our teaching programmes are designed to provide individualised learning support, ensuring students are challenged appropriately and receive the care and guidance they need to succeed.

At Ridgeview School, we are proud to foster confident, connected, lifelong learners within a supportive and inclusive community.

School Expectations

- Uniform: Must be worn daily (summer/winter uniform details provided at enrolment). Uniform is purchased through the school office. This includes, Jumper, Hat, T-shirt. Plain black pants or shorts are not sold at the school office but can be purchased at the Warehouse or Kmart.
- Attendance: Students are expected to attend school every day. Please report absences by 9:00am.
- All Students are expected to have a 90% attendance rate unless absences are justified - Sickness and bereavement

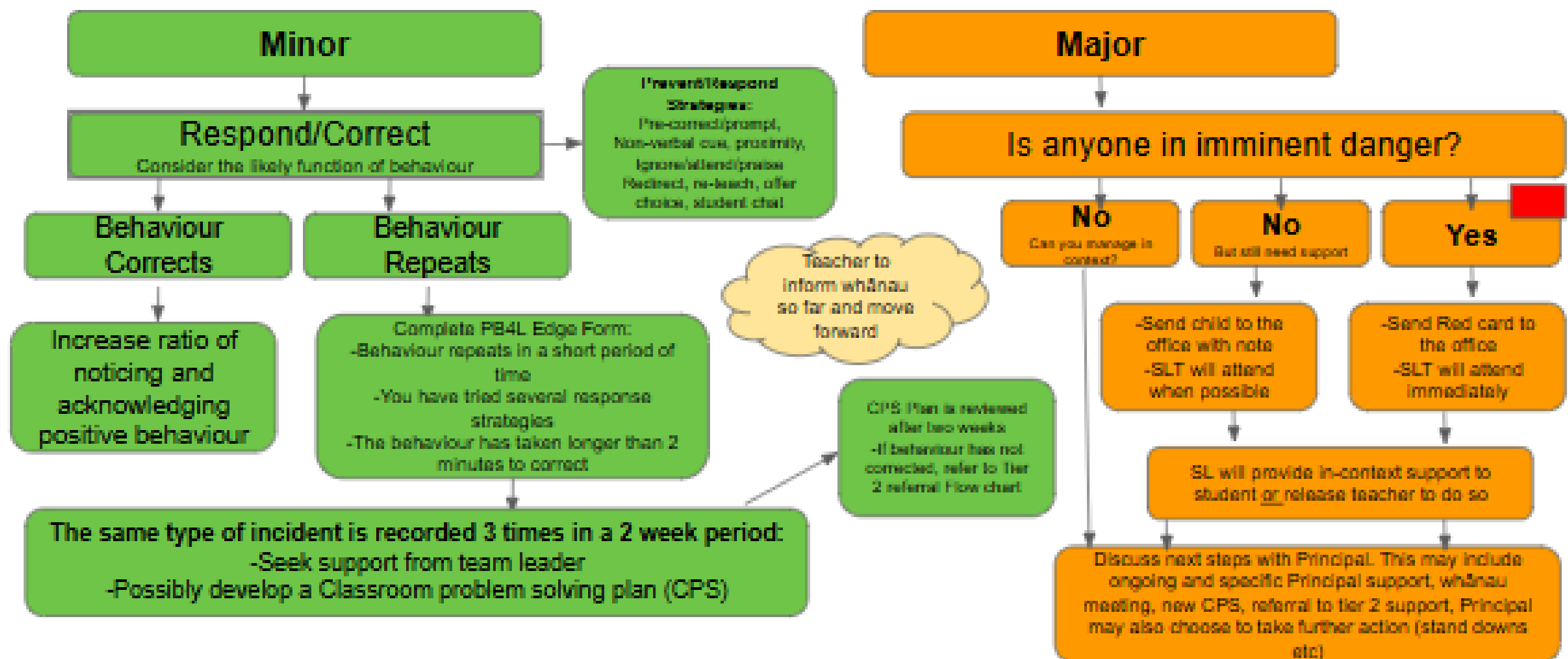

If you are unhappy or have a concern, please follow this process:

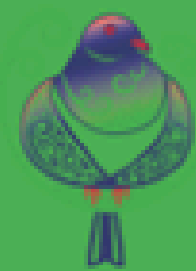
Step 1: Speak to the class teacher or Principal
